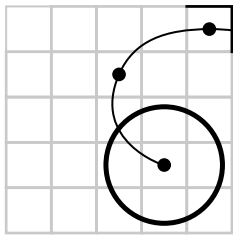

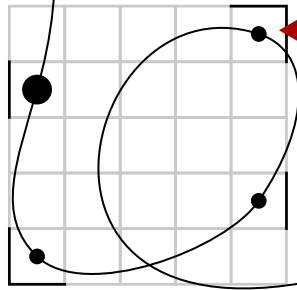

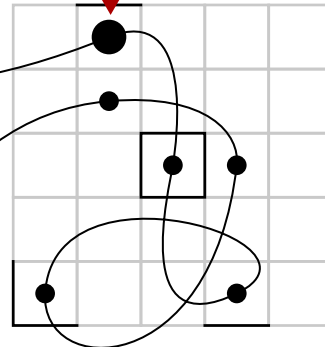
The line connects letters of the alphabet.

Each square grid contains a word.

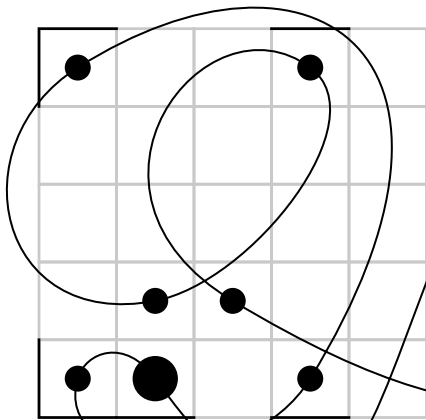
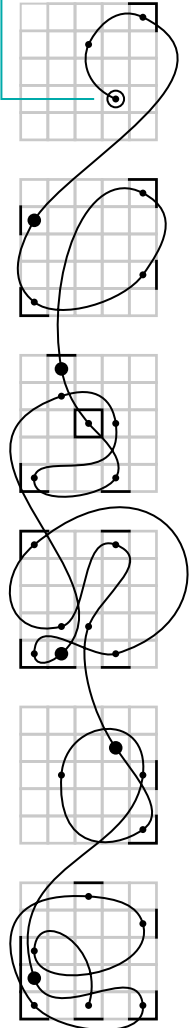
Follow the line to establish the letter order.



Letters are marked by dots. Large ones indicate the first letter of a word.

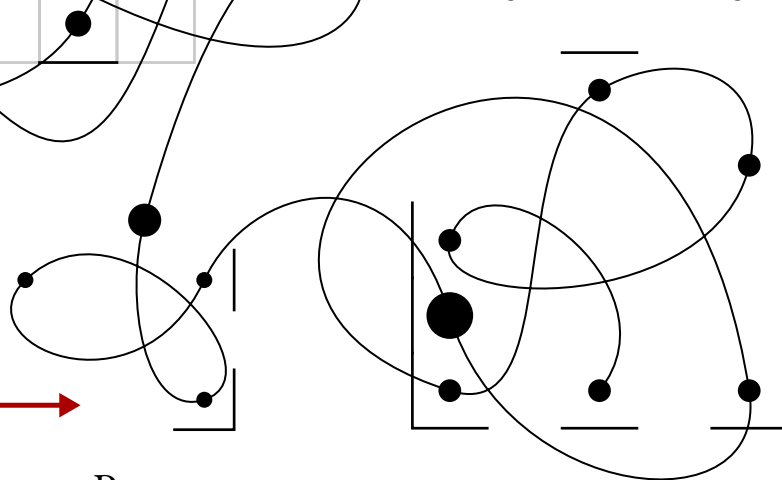


The position of the dot reveals which letter of the alphabet it is according to the above grid layout.



Vowels and letters along the border of a word grid have their edges marked ...

... this is so word grids don't have to be aligned, visible or even the same size to remain legible - edge markings suggest the position of the underlying grid.



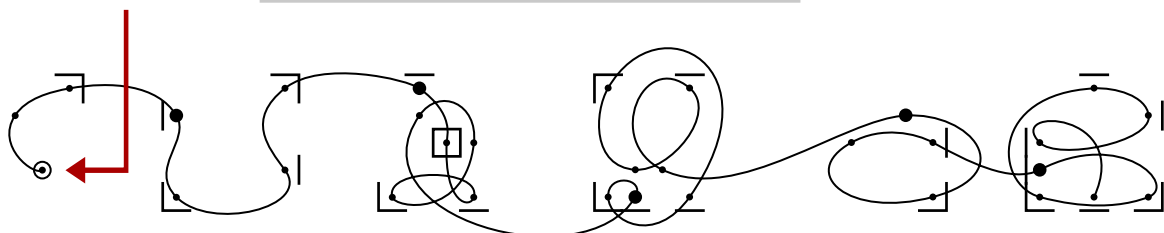
Pangram:

"The five boxing wizards jump quickly."

Capital letters are distinguished by a ring around the dot.

Punctuation can be expressed in a similar way, here are some ideas.
