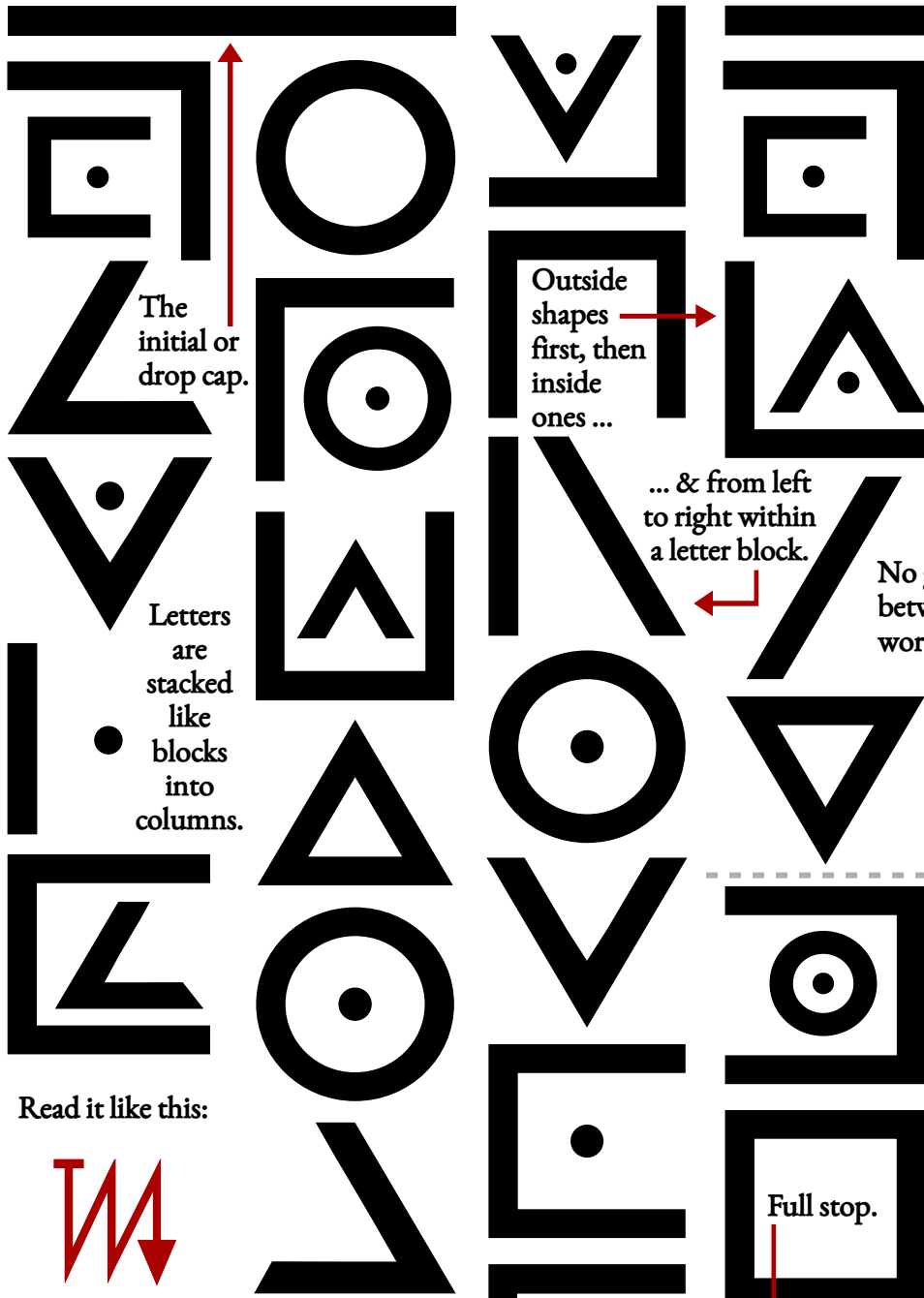


# GEOMETRIGLYPHS



The alphabet is constructed from three basic shapes - the square, circle & triangle.



Read it like this:



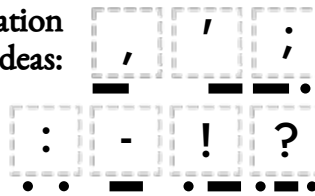

Shorthand symbols can be used for common letter combinations, double vowels and phonetic spelling.

Consecutive letters in the same word can fit one inside the other where there is space, forming ligatures.

The letters are assigned to shapes that loosely resemble their main visual features.
